Yatkin at 7:30 p.m. The three-day event will also feature a special performance and tribute to legendary artist Carmen Delavaladde of Alvin Ailey, master classes by international artists, performances by local dance companies, a plenary roundtable, workshops, panels, master classes, and folk and contemporary dance concerts.
