FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT'S HOLLYHOCK HOUSE

Hollyhock House, the only house designed by Frank Lloyd Wright that is currently open to the public in the city of Los Angeles, is regularly available for tours led by volunteer docents trained by Barnsdall Park's Museum Education and Tours Program.

HOLLYHOCK HOUSE GALLERY

WHAT:

The Hollyhock House Gallery aims to exhibit historic and contemporary work that promotes an understanding of the House's architecture, Frank Lloyd Wright, Aline Barnsdall and the culture of the era in which Hollyhock House was built.

WHAT: **Folding Screens: An Architectural Art** Seeking to "restore" contemporary screens to Hollyhock House rooms where vintage screens were originally displayed but later lost. The exhibition includes 12 contemporary art pieces by 6 artists and 1 designer, as well as documentary photographs of Hollyhock House. Curated by Gabriel Cifarelli.
